## 2025 ITRC Project Team Proposal Form

Completed Project Team Proposal Forms must be submitted by email to ITRC Director Charles Reyes at <a href="mailto:creyes@ecos.org">creyes@ecos.org</a> by May 15, 2024 (5pm ET).

Each Project Team proposal must provide the following information:

**Environmental Topic:** What is the main environmental topic you are addressing with this proposal? A single word, phrase or sentence will be sufficient.

**Project Title:** A clear and concise statement (ideally under 15 words) that accurately reflects the environmental topic being addressed and the intended outcome.

**Project Deliverables:** A list of specific ITRC deliverables the Project Team will develop and clear definition of the primary and intended audience.

- View the ITRC Product Definitions guide. This is not an exhaustive list.
- View <u>ITRC Guidance Products</u> and <u>Training Webpage</u> for examples of recent ITRC deliverables.
- All written project deliverables are required to have an educational and training component developed within the lifetime of the Project Team.

**State Team Leaders:** Provide at least one state government agency employee that you recommend serve as a Team Leader if your proposed Project Team is formed. This does not guarantee selection as a Team Leader.

- View the ITRC Team Leader Guide.
- Provide name, state agency, email, and phone number for each recommended Team Leader.
- Note: All Project Teams are required to have two State Team Leaders.

**Proposal Contacts:** Provide name, organization, and email for everyone submitting this form.

**Problem Statement:** A summary of the problem the ITRC Project Team will seek to address. The problem statement should be specific enough to be achievable by an ITRC Project Team. This should include:

- A clear explanation of the problem, its significance, and why it is important to the environmental community including state government agencies.
- A description and background of the environmental topic and problem what is already known, who has addressed this problem before, and why is past work insufficient at addressing the problem?
- Specific technical and/or regulatory barriers that will be overcome and proposed solutions that will be delivered by the Project Team.
- If this proposal seeks to update an existing ITRC resource, identify what new information will be added.

**Additional Information:** Anything that might be relevant to this proposal to assist reviewers. This may include:

- Brief literature review
- Identifying subject matter experts from states, federal government agencies, and the private sector that may be interested in joining this Project Team.
- Similar work done by other organizations that could be leveraged.

**Enhance your Proposal with a Video Presentation (Optional):** ITRC encourages you submit an optional video presentation no more than 5 minutes in length to complement your written proposal.

- Introduce the Proposal Team to the Board of Advisors.
- Highlight key aspects of the proposal and information that may be helpful during the review process.
